






CROWLEY ISD ENROLLMENT GROWTH (PK-12): 15-YEAR HISTORY

- Redrawing school attendance boundaries
- Maintain safe, equitable distribution of students among different schools
- Necessary as communities grow and new schools are built



- Capacity of campuses
- Demographic factors
- Projected enrollment
- Geographical proximity
- Transportation patterns
- Minimize the impact on families
